Headlines

SCHOOL

5 – 16 years

82% of students have achieved on or above their target achievement in P Levels and National Curriculum Levels.

16 – 19 years

82% of students have achieved on or above their target achievement in P Levels and National Curriculum Levels.

End of Key Stage 2, 3, 4 & 5

87% of students have achieved on or above their target achievement in P levels and National Curriculum Levels.

Accreditation

100% students entered for qualifications in both KS4 & 5 successfully completed these.

COLLEGE

Students overall have achieved **95% full** achievement of their EHCP small steps (targets).

Students overall have achieved **97% full & partial** achievement of their EHCP small steps (targets).

Students with PMLD have achieved **99%** full & partial achievement of their EHCP small steps (targets).

There were no notable gaps in achievement between the categories of students detailed above- Gender, Ethnic group, Day-Res, With-without Epilepsy, SEND CoP Categories of Need, Categories of Learning Difficulty.

All students 5-16 years

Highlights

- Overall 79% of students achieved on or above their target achievement level in English
- Overall 96% of students achieved on or above their target achievement level in Science; 100% female students have achieved on or above their target achievement in Science
- 86% students in receipt of PPG have achieved on or above their target achievement on average across subjects
- 88% Students with MLD achieved on or above their target achievement on average across subjects
- There were no notable gaps in achievement between the majority of the categories of students detailed above - Looked after Children, Ethnic group/ Day-Res/ With-without Epilepsy.

All students 16-19 years

Highlights

- Overall 88% of students achieved on or above their target achievement level in all subjects-English, Mathematics and Science (3/25 students achieved below their target achievement)
- These percentages are consistent across both genders- 88% male students (of total 17 students) and 88% female students (of total 8 students) in all subjects
- 100% 'Looked after Children' achieved on or above their target achievement in all subjects
- 100% Students with MLD achieved on or above their target achievement in all subjects
- 88% students with categories areas of need within the SEND CoP have achieved on or above their target achievement.
- There were no notable gaps in achievement between the majority of the categories of students detailed above-Ethnic group/ Day-Res/ With-without Epilepsy.

Students reaching the End of Key Stage

Highlights

- Overall 83% of students achieved on or above their target achievement level in English and Mathematics
- Overall 96% of students achieved on or above their target achievement level in Science

Breakdown of Highlights:-

Average achievement across these subject areas:-

- 100% students in KS2 (of total 2 students) achieved on or above their target achievement
- 83% students in KS3 (of total 5 students) achieved on or above their target achievement
- 86% students in KS4 (of total 7 students) achieved on or above their target achievement
- 89% students in KS5 (of total 9 students) achieved on or above their target achievement
- 95% of Male students achieved on or above their target achievement level.
- 95% Looked after Children (of total 7 students) have achieved on or above their target achievement
- 88% students with Epilepsy (of total 21 students) have achieved on or above their target achievement
- 94% students in receipt of PPG (of total 6 students) have achieved on or above their target achievement
- There is very little differentiation in the achievement of students in each category of learning difficulty and ethnic groups.
- 100% male students logged against 1 or more SEND CoP categories achieved on or above their target achievement except 1 student in Mathematics.
- 82% Female students, logged against 1 or more SEND CoP categories, achieved on or above their target achievement.

School Accreditation

Students undertake qualifications appropriate to their cognitive abilities through Accreditation Bodies of OCR at both Key Stages 4 and 5 and EdExcel at Key Stage 5.

- We have recently trialled a BTEC Exam in Numeracy through Ed Excel Pearson in 2017/18. One student in school took this exam alongside two students in college, with overall a 100% pass rate at Entry 2.
- Overall students in both KS4 & 5 completed 100% of their accredited courses through OCR, which they were working on in 2017/18.
- Those students, who entered for qualifications through Ed Excel, work on these throughout the 16-19 stage at school (10). Those students who reached the end of KS5 in 2017/18 successfully completed their qualification (4).
